Deep rooted radish with BCN resistance



Target: Weed Suppression, Improved Soil Structure & Nematode Control

Scheme: None

Area: Cover Crop

Sowing period: Summer/Autumn

Deep rooted radish with BCN nematode resistance.

Edwin Oilseed Radish will produce a long tap root up to 1.5-2 metres deep, which will also help the soil structure and is frost resistance up to minus 6 degrees C.

Edwin Oilseed Radish is very leafy at the early stages of growth and is easily incorporated for maximum nematode control.

It also club root resistant.

Strengths

- BCN nematode resistant level 2
- Resistant to heterodera schachtii and betae (BCN)
- Club root resistant



- Non-host to *globodera rostochiensis* and *pallida* (PCN), *heterodera avenae* (cereal cyst nematode), *heterodera goettingiana*, *meloidogyne naasi* (RKN), *ditylenchus dipsaci* and *distructor*, tobacco rattle virus (TRV)

Technical Information

Edwin Oilseed Radish can be sown from July onwards, with a latest sowing date of the end of August.

Sow at 25kg per hectare for heavy soils and 20kg per hectare for light soils.
